#Yieldisyourshield Collaborative Roundabout Enforcement Detail

The Washtenaw County Sheriff's Office, Michigan State Police, Ann Arbor Police Department and Pittsfield Department of Public Safety will step up patrols in designated high-crash roundabouts in Washtenaw County. Officers will conduct traffic stops for violations and will also hand out educational pamphlets to motorists. This takes place from April 4 through May 1. The goal is to reduce crashes at the 18 roundabouts in Washtenaw County. Most crashes occur due to failing to yield and improper lane usage (*turning from the wrong lane*).

How to Drive a Roundabout:

- Choose your lane before entering
- Yield to traffic already in the roundabout
- Yield to pedestrian in crosswalks
- Use signs and pavement marking to help you guide (*Michigan Department of Transportation-MDOT*)
